## USS LEYTE GULF

The USS Leyte Gulf, one of the Council's adopted ships, left from Naval Station Norfolk in June for a seven-month deployment around Europe. The cruiser is the oldest one of its kind on the East Coast. In early July, Standing NATO Maritime Group TWO (SNMG2) began exercises in support of Operation ACTIVE ENDEAVOUR (OAE), two days after Rear Admiral Brad Williamson (US Navy) assumed command. Williamson and his embarked international NATO command staff serve aboard the flagship, USS Leyte Gulf (CG 55); SNMG2 is also comprised of HMCS Regina (Canada) and TCG Kemalreis (Turkey). The operation is part of NATO's multi-faceted response to current terrorist threats. Participants in OAE conduct maritime operations in the Mediterranean Sea to help deter, defend, disrupt and protect against terrorism in the region. Fifteen NATO nations and two partner nations have contributed assets to Operation ACTIVE ENDEAVOUR in the past. This is the first time that a U.S. ship has served as the flagship of SNMG2 since 2007.

## RECOGNITION

At the September 16 Sea Cadet Night dinner, our Council honored Rudy Oetting, a member of the Fort Lauderdale Council, for his financial support of our Care Package Program. Rudy was presented with a plaque by Council President Glenn Wiltshire. The presentation was made with the assistance of several Marines from SOUTHCOM. Rudy sent the following email to Al and Shelly Stein, who have run the Council's Care Package Program and who have sent hundreds of care packages to our deployed military to ensure they are not forgotten by those of us back home.

*Dear Al and Shelly,*

*I was quite surprised and pleased this evening when Glenn Wiltshire presented me with your Council's Service award. It was totally unexpected but much appreciated. I did say to the audience what was true: that you both did a great amount of work over a long period of time. Fortunately, by the way, there were several Marines in attendance: a full Colonel, a Lt. Col. and at least 3 Sgts' so I could bask in their light a bit. My age showed when they were totally unaware of the type of plane (C-119) in which I was an RO. ## COMMISSIONING

A World War II hero was honored when the Coast Guard's newest cutter, the Raymond Evans, was commissioned into service in Key West on September 6. The 154-foot ship is named after Raymond Evans, who received the Navy Cross for rescuing Marines during the Battle of Guadalcanal in 1942. Evans, who eventually retired as a commander in the Coast Guard, died last year. His widow is the official sponsor for the ship and was represented at the ceremony by their grandson.

On September 27, 1942, fierce fighting between enemy Japanese forces and U.S. Marines was taking place on Guadalcanal. The fighting reached a point where the Marine Corps unit was being overrun and the request went out for the U.S. Coast Guard to evacuate them off the beach. Raymond Evans and his shipmate, Douglas Munro, attempted to take approximately 500 Marines off the beach. Sgt. Roy Pugh was among those Marines who was rescued (he continued to fight the war). Evans and Munro gained national acclaim for their heroic rescue operation that saved a Marine Corps unit that was trapped behind enemy lines. Munro gave his life for his country that day and was posthumously awarded the Medal of Honor, and to this day remains the only Coast Guardsmen to receive this award. Evans survived the mission and was awarded the Navy Cross. Evans was commissioned in mid-1943 and continued his Coast Guard career after the war, retiring as a Commander in 1962.

The Raymond Evans is one of six new Sentinel-class cutters that will be homeported in Key West. The Charles David, Jr., the Charles Sexton and the Kathleen Moore have already been commissioned. The new cutters are replacing the 110-foot island-class cutters that underwent a failed retrofit and are being phased out of service.

# SEA SERVICE NEWS



Chief of Naval Operations Adm. Jonathan Greenert visited Naval Air Station Key West for an all-hands call and tour of enlisted housing on August 27. Greenert's visit was part of a Southeast

U.S. tour, which included stops at Southern Command, Joint Interagency Task Force-South, Naval Station Guantanamo Bay, Central Command, and Special Operations Command. At each of the stops Greenert met with leadership and Sailors to listen and learn what was on their minds. During an all-hands call, Greenert reenlisted 19 Sailors and presented awards to 11 Sailors and one civilian assigned to NAS Key West and its tenant commands.



Naval Aircrewman (Helicopter) 1st Class Nicholas Wyandt participates in search and rescue training with fellow members of Helicopter Combat Squadron 22 Sea Knights. Amphibious assault ship USS Bataan (LHD 5) is the flagship for the Bataan Amphibious

Ready Group and, with the embarked 22nd Marine Expeditionary Unit, is deployed in support of maritime security operations and theater security cooperation efforts in the U.S. 5th Fleet area of responsibility .



Approximately 719 kilograms of cocaine worth an estimated wholesale value of more than \$23 million were offloaded at Coast Guard Station Miami Beach on September 18. The offload is a result of a successful drug interdiction in the Caribbean

on September 8 when the Coast Guard Cutter Bear boarded a suspicious cargo vessel and discovered contraband which tested positive for cocaine. The Coast Guard took thirteen suspected smugglers into custody.



The George Washington and Carl Vinson Carrier Strike Groups, as well as land-based aircraft from Marine Corps Air Group 12 and Air Force 36th Operations Group completed dynamic war-at-sea exercises (WASEX) as part of

Valiant Shield September 16 and 18. These WASEXs utilized joint assets to simulate long range strikes against hostile surface warships in order to improve joint interoperability, to assess dual carrier strike group and joint operations and to conduct maritime threat neutralization. Participants in Valiant Shield include the Nimitz-class aircraft carriers USS George Washington (CVN 73) and its embarked air wing, Carrier Air Wing (CVW) 5, and USS Carl Vinson (CVN 70) and its embarked air wing, CVW-17, cruisers and destroyers, Valiant Shield is the largest joint unilateral military exercise in the Pacific this year, with a focus on integration of joint training among U.S. forces.



On October 6, hundreds of wounded veterans, military advocates and government officials gathered in Washington, D.C., for the dedication of the American Veterans Disabled for Life Memorial. The event was the culmination of 16

years of work and \$80 million in private donations, and drew praise as a long-overdue thank you for those whose wounds extended past the battlefield. There are about 4 million disabled veterans in America, with almost a quarter of that total from the conflicts in Iraq and Afghanistan. The new site is unusual in its dedication to both deceased and living veterans, setting aside much of its commemoration for individuals still able to visit the site and talk about its personal meaning. This memorial sits in the shadow of the Capitol building, a reminder from its designers that costs of armed conflict linger far beyond the battlefield.

Support of visiting military vessels: Council greets each visiting military vessel and hosts All Hands Parties for the crews. Ship tours and onboard receptions are arranged when possible.

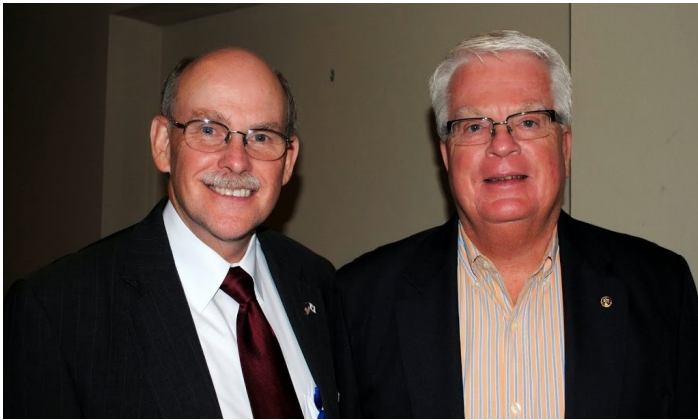
Dinner Socials: Council provides guest speakers who will share information on issues affecting the Sea Services. This is a great opportunity to interact with other Navy Leaguers.
