

NEWS FROM THE SEA SERVICES



Fabrication of the future USNS Vigilant (JHSV 2), the first joint high speed vessel (JHSV) to be operated by the Navy, began September 13 at the Austal USA shipyard in Mobile, Ala. The JHSV will be used for fast intra-theater transportation of troops, military vehicles and equipment. The Navy's Strategic and Theater Sealift Program (PMS 385) in the Program Executive Office Ships is procuring the vessels for both the Army and the Navy. Vigilant is the second vessel in the class. The first, the future U.S. Army vessel USAV Spearhead (JHSV 1), is scheduled for delivery to the Army in 2012.



Sailors aboard the multipurpose amphibious assault ship USS Bataan (LHD 5) successfully completed an air certification September 16, proving the ship's ability to safely launch and recover aircraft and support multiple air operations. The certification focused on the practical application of connecting rotary, tilt, and fixed wing aviation operations, as well as observing and assessing the ship's ability to conduct air traffic control at sea. The air certification was the final of a three-phase aviation qualification process. Bataan has also passed an aviation readiness qualification (ARQ) and aviation certification (AVCERT). During ARQ, inspectors from Afloat Training Group Mid-Atlantic assessed the crew's aviation training and medical readiness. AVCERT ensured the material readiness of the ship was safe for flight operations.

The certification will allow Bataan to conduct air operations for the next two years.



World Trade Center Steel Foundation Vice President Ken Senter, along with Oak Ridge, Tenn. high school students, presented USS New York (LPD 21) with a piece of steel from the World Trade Center in mid-September in Norfolk VA. Cmdr. Curt Jones, USS New York commanding officer, accepted the 42-pound piece of steel on behalf of the crew during a brief ceremony in the ship's pilothouse. The event is part of an ongoing effort for Oak Ridge High School student council members who took on the challenge of delivering a piece of the steel column to all 50 States. Senter explained how the steel illustrated what happened on 9/11. The piece presented to the ship included support bolts that had been bent and sheared off from the weight of the building as it collapsed.

The column was given to the school by New York City Mayor Michael Bloomberg.

U.S. Transportation Secretary Ray LaHood announced that Rear Admiral Philip H. Greene, Jr. will become the new Superintendent of the U.S. Merchant Marine Academy in Kings Point, NY. Admiral Greene holds a Merchant Marine Master's license and is a 1978 Academy graduate. Rear Admiral Greene comes to Kings Point from the U.S. Navy, where he was most recently Director of the Navy Irregular Warfare Office. Before that, Rear Admiral Greene served as Commander of the Combined Joint Task Force - Horn of Africa, where he helped establish the first multinational Maritime Center of Excellence in East Africa. Previously, as Executive Assistant to the Superintendent and Chairman of the Seamanship and Navigation Department at the United States Naval Academy, he shaped the mandatory professional mariner curriculum and instruction for 4,000 midshipmen. In addition to his degree from the U.S. Merchant Marine Academy, Admiral Greene holds advanced degrees from the Naval Postgraduate School and the National

The Marine Corps' amphibious nature has made it unique from all other branches in the military. From World War II to the present, in war and in peace, the Corps has navigated the seas to bring an end to tyranny and help those who are in need. To remain skilled in fighting in amphibious environments, Marines participate in annual swim qualifications training. Various commands throughout Marine Corps Logistics Base Albany GA sent 130 Marines to complete their annual swim qualification requirements at the base pool in mid-September. All 130 Marines qualified and 15 qualified as Water Survival Qualified (WSQ), the highest level. Once a Marine obtains WSQ, they must re-qualify every six years.


