HONOR FLIGHT

The sole purpose of Honor Flight South Florida is to transport (at no cost to the veterans) American military veterans to the memorials erected to honor them in Washington DC. On October 11, Honor Flight took a group of WWII veterans, including Allan McElhiney of Naval Air Station Museum Fort Lauderdale, to the nation's capital. The group visited sites such as the WWII memorial, the Korean memorial, the Iwo Jima memorial and the Tomb of the Unknowns where they witnessed the changing of the guard. When the group returned that evening to the Fort Lauderdale Airport, they were greeted by a large group of individuals including the Spruance Division Sea Cadets, Navy Leaguers, and local politicians.

Commander Long is a native of Atlanta Georgia. He enlisted in the Navy in 1989 as a Cryptologic Tech-He earned his commission in 1993 as an nician. Intelligence Officer. In 1996, CDR Long reported to the Naval Reserve Recruiting Command as an Officer Recruiter and Division Officer in St Louis, Missouri. In 1999, he reported to the Naval Reserve Recruiting Command Area Southeast in Orlando. In November 2001, CDR Long assumed command of Navy Operational Support Center in Tuscaloosa Alabama. From March 2004 to March 2005, he drilled as a Selected Reservist while completing his Master of Science degree in Human Resources. In April 2005, he was recalled back to active duty where he assumed command of NOSC Decatur Illinois. In April 2007, he reported to the Navy Recruiting Command Region West where he served a three-year tour. In July 2010, CDR Long reported to NPC where he completed a tour as the PERS 4012 Branch Head for Enlisted FTS Detailing. In September 2012, he reported to Navy Region Mid-Atlantic Norfolk.

SEA SERVICE NEWS



Gen. Joseph Dunford, who led coalition military forces in Afghanistan for most of the last two years, took over as the new top officer in the Marine Corps on Oc-

tober 17th, replacing retiring Gen. James F. Amos in a ceremony on the lush green lawn at Marine Barracks Washington. Dunford, 59, will lead the service as it continues to shift focus after more than a decade of war in Irag and Afghanistan. The Marine Corps is shrinking from a peak of about 202,000 service members at the height of the Afghanistan war in 2010 to no more than 182,100, and has launched a number of new, land-based crisis-response units to respond to emergencies that threaten Americans and U.S. interests abroad. "My focus in the coming years will be to take care of our Marines and their families, and to ensure our Corps remains an expeditionary force of readiness our nation has come to expect," he said. In a letter to all Marines, he added that he engage with Marines of all ranks, developing "detailed Commandant's Planning Guidance in the New Year."

Bataan Amphibious Ready Group is deployed supporting maritime security operations, providing crisis response capability, increasing theater security cooperation and a forward naval presence.



Sailors assigned to Detachment 1, Helicopter Maritime Strike Squadron (HSM-48), embarked on Standing NATO Maritime Group 2 (SNMG2)

flagship USS Leyte Gulf (CG 55), assisted in the medical evacuation of a Sailor aboard French navy oil tanker FS Marne (A630) on October 24. The distress call came in at 3 p.m., Oct. 24, and HSM -48 quickly coordinated a plan to pick up the ill Sailor and transport him to shore. Within 45 minutes of receiving the call, Leyte Gulf set flight quarters to launch HSM-48's SH-60B Seahawk. The Sailor was hoisted into the helicopter and transported to Naval Station Rota where awaiting paramedics transported him to a local hospital.



Secretary of the Navy Ray Mabus named N o v e m b e r 2014 Warrior Care Month in an all-Navy m e s s a g e (ALNAV) to Navy and Ma-

rine Corps personnel released on October 27. Warrior Care Month is an annual effort to increase awareness of resources available to seriously wounded, ill and injured service members, their families, and those who care for them. This year's theme, "A Show of Strength," recognizes the fortitude and resiliency that seriously wounded, ill and injured service members exhibit during their journey toward recovery. Since its inception, Navy Wounded Warrior has provided world-class assistance to more than 3,100 Sailors and Coast Guardsmen and their families throughout the country. It provides a lifetime of non-medical care to seriously wounded, ill and injured service members, guiding them through their recovery, rehabilitation and reintegration. 
