First Sergeant Michele J. Hill was born in San Diego, CA, and raised in Nebraska. Upon graduation from high school Hill enlisted in the Marine Corps Private Hill graduated from MCRD Parris Island, South Carolina and reported to Marine Combat Training at Camp Geiger, North Carolina. After completing MCT, she received orders to her Mili-

tary Occupational Specialty School of Supply Administration in Camp Johnson, North Carolina in January 2000. During school, Pvt Hill was promoted to Private First Class in Feb 2000. PFC Hill graduated MOS School and reported to Headquarters Battery, 12th Marines Regiment in March 2000 where she served as the Fiscal clerk. During her extended tour in Okinawa with 12th Marines, PFC Hill was meritoriously promoted to Lance Corporal in June 2000 and Corporal in December 2000. In March 2002, Cpl Hill was given orders to History and Museums Division, Headquarters Marine Corps, Arlington, Virginia. There, Cpl Hill worked as the Supply NCOIC, Publications NCOIC, and as the security manager. Cpl Hill graduated from Supply Intermediate Course April 2002. In November 2002, she was promoted to the rank of Sergeant. Sgt Hill requested special duty orders to Marine Security Guard School and graduated in May 2004. While on Marine Security Guard, she served as the Assistant Detachment Commander in Bolivia, Italy, and Nicaragua. She was promoted to Staff Sergeant in June 2006. After successfully completing her MSG duty, SSgt Hill returned to her MOS of Supply Administration with orders to Inspector Instructor duty, Roosevelt Roads, Puerto Rico, During this tour, she served as the Supply Chief and as the Toys for Tots Coordinator for all the Caribbean. SSgt Hill was promoted to the rank of Gunnery Sergeant in November 2010. GySgt Hill was assigned to Camp Pendleton, California in November 2010, as the Fiscal Staff Non-commissioned Officer In Charge (SNCOIC), Supply Management Unit, 1st Supply Battalion. In September 2011, Gunnery Sergeant Hill was selected to serve on the I Marine Expeditionary Force Female Engagement Team (FET) 12-1 as the SNCOIC. After completing a 6month intensive work up; she deployed with the I MEF FET in support of Operation Enduring Freedom to Regional Command Southwest, Afghanistan in March 2012. After her deployment in August of 2012, GySgt Hill returned to 1st Supply Battalion as the Customer

Service SNCOIC. In June of 2013, GySgt Hill reported to the Wounded Warrior Detachment aboard Balboa Naval Medical Center San Diego where she served as the Operations Chief and later as the Company First Sergeant. After selection to First Sergeant, she reported to Combat Logistics Battalion 1 aboard Camp Pendleton in March 2015 where she served as both the Remain Behind Element Sergeant Major and the Headquarters and Service Company First Sergeant. In June 2016, First Sergeant Hill reported to Marine Corps Embassy Security Guard where she currently serves as the Region 9 First Sergeant.

Her personal awards include a Navy Marine Corps Commendation medal with 3 gold stars in lieu of 4th Award, Navy Marine Corps Achievement Medal with 1 gold star in lieu of 2nd Award, Good Conduct Medal with 4 bronze stars, Combat Action Ribbon, Marine Security Guard Ribbon.

Each year, Broward Navy Days hosts a Pearl Harbor Remembrance Ceremony at Coast Guard Station Fort Lauderdale. This year, for the first time, there will not be a Pearl Harbor survivor in attendance. 

NEWS FROM OUR SEA SERVICES



On November 10, Captain Brad Busch (right in photo) relieved Captain Eric Pfister as the commanding officer of the USS Bataan LHD 5. Busch is the

15th commanding officer since Bataan's commissioning in 1997. "It has been the highest honor serving as the Bataan's Commanding Officer," said Pfister. "Seventeen months ago, I stood at this podium, with a mile-wide grin excited at the prospect of assuming command; awed by the responsibility, but confident in the preparations the Navy provided me. Throughout my eight months of training prior to arriving to Bataan, at every turn I met people who had been Bataan Sailors, Bataan commanding officers or they worked with the Bataan all they echoed what a great ship this was." *Story and photo from USS Bataan's Facebook page.*



On November 13, former U.S. Navy captain and pilot Thomas Hudner Jr. died; he was 93. Hudner was awarded the Medal of Honor during the Korean War in 1950 after his plane came under enemy fire and he crashlanded in an unsuccessful effort to save the life of his wingman and friend, Ensign Jesse Brown, the Navy's first

black combat pilot. Hudner watched this year as the USS Thomas Hudner, a destroyer, was christened at Bath Iron Works in Maine. *Story and photo from MarineCorpsTimes.com*



Rob Jones is a retired Marine Corps Sergeant. He lost both of his legs while serving in Afghanistan in 2010. While in Afghanistan, Jones was responsible for clearing an area of explosive devices in Tali-

ban territory. A landmine detonated near him, injured his legs and resulted in doctors having to amputate both of his legs. Jones is not letting his injuries prevent him from helping other injured veterans. On Veterans Day, he completed his 31st marathon in 31 days; he competed in one marathon every day. His goal is to raise money for a group of charities that benefit wounded warriors. So far he has raised more than \$125,000. "My objective with the 31 marathons in 31 days is to just get a story out there about a veteran that went to Afghanistan, had a traumatic experience, came back you know minus two legs, but was still able to find my new way that I was going to contribute to my country and my society and keep fighting for my brother veterans," Jones said. Jones has also won a bronze medal in the Paralympics, biked 5,200 miles across the country and climbed 104 flights of stairs at the One World Trade Center in New York City. *Story from wgntv.com; photo from USAToday.com*



On November 14, the crew of the Coast Guard Cutter Spencer offloaded approximately 10 tons of cocaine and 23 kilograms of heroin in Port Everglades worth an

estimated \$300 million wholesale seized in international waters off the Eastern Pacific Ocean. The drugs were interdicted along Mexico and Central America by multiple U.S. Coast Guard cutters. The offload represents 14 separate, suspected drug smuggling vessel interdictions by the Coast Guard. *Story and photo from Coast Guard News.mil*



On November 15, the Navy accepted delivery of future guided-missile destroyer USS Ralph Johnson (DDG 114) from shipbuilder Huntington

Ingalls Industries (HII). DDG 114's namesake, Pfc. Ralph H. Johnson, received the Medal of Honor for his actions during Operation Rock in the Vietnam War, 1968. Johnson jumped on top of a tossed grenade to spare his fellow Marines from the blast. The heroic action took Johnson's life but saved the lives of his brothers in arms and undoubtedly prevented the enemy from penetrating his sector of the perimeter. "The namesake of this ship is a true American patriot who sacrificed his life for the safety of his fellow Marines and his country," said Capt. Casey Moton, DDG 51 class program manager, Program Executive Office Ships. DDG 114 is the 64th Arleigh Burke class destroyer and the third of the DDG 51 Flight IIA restart ships to deliver. *Story and photo from Navy.mil*
