

## JANUARY GUEST SPEAKER



Lieutenant Brittany Panetta is the Commanding Officer of the USCGC MARGARET NORVELL (WPC 1105). She is a 2009 graduate of the Coast Guard Academy, where she earned a Bachelor of Science degree in Management.

LT Panetta served as the Deck Watch Officer and First Lieutenant onboard USCGC VIGILANT (WMEC 617), homeported in Cape Canaveral, Florida from 2009 to 2011.

LT Panetta then transferred to CGC NANTUCKET (WPB 1316), homeported in St. Petersburg, Florida where she served as Executive Officer until 2013. While onboard NANTUCKET, she assisted in the disestablishment of the D7 High-Tempo High-Maintenance (HTHM) Patrol boat program, completed over \$3.1M worth of cutter maintenance, and oversaw the interdiction and humanitarian care of more than 350 illegal immigrants.

In July 2013, LT Panetta reported to Washington D.C. as the Assistant Coast Guard Liaison Officer for the United States House of Representatives. In this capacity, she worked to advance Coast Guard legislative priorities, including passage of two authorization Acts and Appropriations Acts for fiscal years 2014-2016. She also played a key role in promoting the visibility and understanding of Coast Guard programs, missions, and priorities in Congress.


LT Panetta's personal awards include the Coast Guard Commendation Medal and Coast Guard Achievement Medal, with Operational Distinguishing Devices.

## FLIGHT 19 MEMORIAL

On Monday, December 5, Naval Air Station Museum (NAS) Fort Lauderdale hosted the 71st anniversary Flight 19 memorial ceremony. The event took place at the Museum Building located near the Fort Lauderdale/Hollywood International Airport. The ceremony commemorated 14 crewmen from the 5 TBM Avenger airplanes and 13 crewmen from the Mariner rescue seaplane who all vanished on December 5, 1945.

## SEA SERVICE NEWS



The Coast Guard joined with officials from the Royal Canadian Navy on December 15 at Port Everglades to highlight what the agency called "one of the largest drug of-

floads" in its history. The operation filled most of the flight deck of the 418-foot Coast Guard Cutter Hamilton with more than three dozen pallets stacked with cocaine, seized during 27 vessel interdictions and five drug bale recovery operations in the eastern Pacific. "Today we'll be offloading 53,000 pounds. That's equivalent to about 24,000 kilograms of cocaine ... with an estimated wholesale value of \$715 million. That's probably equivalent to 2-plus billion on the streets of America," said Vice Adm. Karl Schultz, commander of the U.S. Coast Guard Atlantic Area. The amount of cocaine on the deck of the Hamilton was so massive that a crane was used to lower the drug-laden pallets to the dock.



Huntington Ingalls Industries' Ingalls Shipbuilding division was awarded a \$1.46 billion contract for the detail design and construction of the amphibious transport dock Fort Lauderdale

(LPD 28). The LPD 28 is named Fort Lauderdale to honor the Florida city's historic ties to the U.S. Navy, which date to the 1830s and include an important naval training center during World War II. The 684 foot long, 105 foot wide San Antonio class ships are a major part of the Navy's 21st century amphibious assault force.

The ship is underway with the Bataan Amphibious Ready Group (ARG) participating in ARG/Marine Expeditionary Unit Exercise.



This fiscal year Marines will receive smart phones that make calling for fire support easier, quicker and more accurate. The Target Handoff

System Version 2 is a portable system designed for use by dismounted Marines to locate targets, pinpoint global positioning coordinates and call for close air, artillery and naval fire support using secure digital communications. The system is an upgrade to the Corps' current Target Handoff System and is made up of a laser range finder, video down link receiver and a combat net radio. THS V.2 uses commercial off-the-shelf smartphones that reduce the system's total weight from roughly 20 to 10 pounds, making it easier to transport. It also features new, more intuitive software. Information is transmitted via an encrypted combat net radio, ensuring mission security.



On December 19, Coast Guard Commandant Adm. Paul Zukunft served as the keynote speaker for the First Flight Society's annual celebration at the Wright Brothers Memorial in Kill Devil Hills, North Carolina. The ceremony marked the 113th anniversary of the Wright

brothers' first flight, commemorated 100 years of Coast Guard aviation and honored the service of two Coast Guard aviators, Capt. Frank Erickson and Cmdr. Stewart Graham. Erickson was the first Coast Guard helicopter pilot and was assigned to the service's first helicopter detachment. In the early 1940's, he trained over 100 U.S. and British service members to fly helicopters. Graham began his Coast Guard career as a surfman, but earned his wings as a naval pilot and underwent training to become the Coast Guard's second helicopter pilot. Graham completed the first helicopter take-off and landing on a vessel on the high seas. Erickson and Graham took part in the "Miracle at Gander" rescue in Gander, Newfoundland, 1946, when a passenger plane crashed in a remote location. They successfully rescued 18 passengers from the crash site and demonstrated the ability of helicopters to perform under such circumstances.
