COAST GUARD NEWS



Vice Adm. Karl L. Schultz has been nominated to be 26th the commandant of the U.S. Coast Guard. Homeland Security Secretary Kirstjen M. Nielsen an-

nounced the nomination by President Donald J. Trump on March 8. Schultz, commander of the Coast Guard's Atlantic Area, currently serves as the operational commander for all Coast Guard missions from the Rocky Mountains to the Persian Gulf, spanning five Coast Guard districts and 40 states. He also serves as commander, Defense Force East, and provides Coast Guard mission support to the Department of Defense and combatant commanders. Pending confirmation, he is expected to relieve Adm. Paul F. Zukunft as commandant in a change-of command ceremony June 1 in Washington. Zukunft will retire this summer.

Schultz's previous operational assignments included sector command in Miami as well as command tours aboard the cutters Venturous, Acacia and Farallon. Staff assignments have included chief of the Office of Congressional and Governmental Affairs; congressional liaison officer to the U.S. House of Representatives; liaison officer to the U.S. Department of State, Bureau for International Narcotics and Law Enforcement Affairs; assignment officer at the Coast Guard Personnel Command; and command duty officer in the 7th Coast Guard District Operations Center in Miami.

The president also has nominated Vice Adm. Charles W. Ray, the current deputy commandant for Operations, as the Coast Guard's 31st vice commandant. Pending confirmation, Ray will relieve Adm. Charles D. Michel in a change-of-watch ceremony May 24 in Washington. Michel, the Coast Guard's first four-star vice commandant, will retire following the change of watch.
