Second Vice President Marianne Giambrone and National Vice President & Board Member Joe Giambrone will accept the award on the Council's behalf at the National Convention in Portland Oregon in June.

COAST GUARD NEWS

It was recently announced that BMCM Mathew J. Coppola, currently the Officer in Charge of the USCGC Gannet, was selected as the thirteenth Silver (Enlisted) Ancient Mariner since the inception of the program in 1978. BMCM Coppola assumed the title of Silver Ancient Mariner from MCPO-CG Steven W. Cantrell during a ceremony onboard USCGC Bear in Portsmouth, VA on April 30. BMCM Coppola has over 17 years of sea time while serving aboard 7 Coast Guard cutters and has been OIC of CGC BELUGA (WPB 87325), CGC FINBACK (WPB 87334) and CG STA Wrightsville Beach. The Ancient Mariner title recognizes the officer and enlisted person with the earliest designation as a permanent cutterman and requires a minimum of ten years of sea time. The award recipients must personify and uphold the core values of honor, respect and devotion to duty, along with the professionalism and leadership associated with long service at sea.

On May 1, the crew of our adopted ship, the USCGC Bernard C. Webber said goodbye to LTJG David Westland who will be reporting to flight training to continue his career as a Coast Guard Aviator. AST2 Samuel Knoeppel, a Rescue Swimmer at Air Station Miami, was recognized as the South Florida Federal Employee of the year. He was voted the Number 1 employee out of thousands of federal employees in the area. Additionally, AST2 Knoeppel received the South Florida Federal Employee Award for Valor 2017. He was recognized for maintaining Aviation Life Support Equipment for over 280 aircrew and 10 aircraft, deploying to Houston, Texas in the wake of Hurricane Harvey, and saving more than 27 lives. Additionally, he provided life saving medical care to two individuals in the helicopter while enroute to the hospital. Due to the helicopter being unable to land at the hospital's pad, he carried the individuals 150 yds through the mud to get them to care. 
BLUE STAR MUSEUMS

Each summer since 2010, Blue Star Museums have offered free admission to the nation's active-duty military personnel and their families, including National Guard and Reserve, from Memorial Day through Labor Day. The Museum of Discovery & Science is located at 401 SW 2nd Street in Fort Lauderdale. According to their website (mods.org), the Museum consists of 119,000 square feet of interior space, a 300-seat AutoNation IMAX Theater, an open-air Grand Atrium

featuring the Great Gravity Clock and the newly opened outdoor Science Park. The Museum features dynamic interactive exhibits in the natural and physical sciences and a large array of programs designed to serve diverse audiences. The Museum regularly serves over 400,000 visitors each year and is the primary destination for school field trips in Broward County. The ability of the Museum to entertain and educate children and adults through immersive exhibits, engaging educational programming and films, and a live animal collection adds immeasurably to the region's educational resources.

The White House announced that President Donald J. Trump will award the Medal of Honor to Master Chief Petty Officer (SEAL), Retired, Britt Slabinski for his heroic actions in March 2002 during the Battle of Takur Ghar while serving in Afghanistan. Slabinski will be awarded the Medal of Honor during a White House

ceremony on May 24, 2018 for his actions while leading a team under heavy effective enemy fire in an attempt to rescue teammate Petty Officer First Class Neil Roberts during Operation ANACONDA in 2002. (*story and photo from Navy.mil*)



As the need and scope of the military's unmanned systems continues to grow, the Navy plans to establish a com-

mand devoted to aviation drones this fall. Air Test and Evaluation Squadron Two Four (UX24) will come into existence at Webster Outlying Field in Maryland in October, according to an OPNAV instruction issued in April. UX24's mission will involve providing research, development, testing and other support for Navy and Marine Corps drone systems. That mission is currently performed by Naval Test Wing Atlantic, but growth in the field requires a command solely focused on the aviation drone mission, the OPNAV states. The Navy's aerial drone fleet has grown to run the gamut in recent years, and ranges from smaller models to plans for the MQ-25, a drone that will be able to refuel manned aircraft midflight. 


EAGLE SCOUT PROJECT
