

Here comes the first-ever surface drone fleet

Send in the sea drones!

Er, or the "unmanned surface vehicles," in the preferred Big Navy nomenclature.

Either way, 2023 should see the sea service stand up its first ever unmanned surface fleet by the end of the summer.

While the Navy and the U.S. military in general spent much of 2022 focused on the European theater following Russia's invasion of Ukraine, not to mention the whole China situation, the Navy's drone arm has been quietly hard at work in the Middle Eastern waters of U.S. 5th Fleet testing and developing all types of drone platforms.


Task Force 59, stood up in September 2021 to oversee the effort, has in roughly the past year operated surface drones in area waters for more than 25,000 hours, and the Saildrone Explorer in particular logged 220 consecutive days at sea with no refueling or maintenance.

"The pace of innovation is amazing," Capt. Michael Brasseur, TF 59's commander, said in a statement. "We are challenging our industry partners in one of the most difficult operational environments, and they are responding with enhanced capability, fast."

"By harnessing these new unmanned technologies and combining them with artificial intelligence, we will enhance regional maritime security and strengthen deterrence," Vice Adm. Brad Cooper, 5th Fleet's commander, said in a statement. "This benefits everybody."

US Coast Guard Gives 'Round of Appaws' for Rescue of Dog that Fell Through Ice

DETROIT – A U.S. Coast Guard crew rescued a dog that fell through the ice into the Detroit River over the holiday weekend, officials said.

USCG Sector Detroit called for a "round of appaws" for Petty Officer Cole Harper and the boat crew that successfully rescued the struggling dog, according to a Facebook post.

The crew from Station Belle Isle was underway when they spotted the dog struggling in the water near Grayhaven Island, the post said.

The dog was removed from the water and wrapped in blankets, the post said. She was later turned over to Detroit Animal Care and Control.

USS Paul Ignatius – DDG 117

The guided-missile destroyer Paul Ignatius returned to Rota, Spain, on Tuesday from a patrol in the 6th Fleet — its first as a Forward-Deployed Naval Forces-Europe ship.

The Ignatius' homeport shift from Mayport, Florida, earlier this year aligns with the Navy's plan to rotate the destroyers based in Rota and comes as the service aims to bolster its destroyer fleet in Spain from four to six warships in the next several years.

During the patrol, which kicked off in August, the ship operated in the Arctic Ocean, Baltic Sea and North Sea conducting theater antisubmarine warfare, air and missile defense, surface warfare training, and exhibiting expeditionary warfare capabilities.

Bernard C. Webber – WPC 1101



The destroyer integrated with the Kearsarge Amphibious Readiness Group and Marines from the 22nd Marine Expeditionary Unit in the Baltic Sea to conduct interoperability operations with NATO allies. Additionally, the ship participated in the Finnish Navy Commandled exercise "Freezing Winds" in the Baltic Sea, along with units and personnel from 11 other countries.

"I couldn't be more proud of this crew," Cmdr. Corry Lougee, executive officer of Paul Ignatius, said in a Navy news release. "We have been operational since February, and this ship continues to excel. Our Sailors executed the most successful homeport change to date, fought through the adversity of patrol, and now return to our new homeport stronger than ever. The mental toughness of this crew is beyond words, and we are so appreciative of the overwhelming support from our families, the base, Destroyer Squadron 60 and the amazing Spanish people of Rota."

The ship was commissioned in 2019 and is named after former Secretary of the Navy Paul Ignatius, who served during the Lyndon B. Johnson administration. The destroyer arrived in Rota June 17.


